



## A LETTER FROM OUR CEO, KAREN STERK

Dear Friends -

What is the WHY of the Jeannette Rankin Foundation?

The answer jumped out at me while reading the Sunday paper.

Tara Westover, author of the book **Educated**, talked about her experience of putting herself through college in the 90's - a time when you could actually put yourself through college with summer and part time work. She received her first Pell Grant.

***In those desperate years a few thousand dollars was enough to alter the whole course of my life. It contained a universe.***

Know that this is what you do when you support JRF Scholars.

***The Pell Grant was my first taste of financial security. When the program was established 50 years ago, the largest grant covered 79 percent of the costs to attend a four-year public college. Today it covers just 29 percent. It's not enough. What the grant offered me - security, peace of mind, a space in which to consider, for the first time, what sort of life I wanted - it no longer offers.***

As little as two thousand dollars extra a year for non school expenses was cited by the Institute of Women's Policy Research (IWPR) as critical to a Scholar Mom's success.

That is precisely why you are critical to the success of JRF Scholars.

***Because of you*** we were able to raise the amount of the Scholar Grant from \$2,000 to \$2,500 last year. ***Because of you*** we were able to support 57% more Scholars this year. (86 last year and 135 this year.)
