Thank You for supporting 260 Rankin Scholars for the 2025–2026 school year. Your investment in Rankin Scholars is transforming the futures of 260 incredible women. As a new Rankin Scholar or returning Scholar continuing with their education, each of them is on a path toward a brighter future, and we're honored that you are part of their journey.

Becoming a Rankin Scholar is a rigorous process. Thank You to our dedicated Volunteer Application Readers! Your work through three rounds of evaluation — often with nearly 45 different sets of eyes reviewing those who reach the final round — gave us the class of 2025–2026. This year, we received 525 applications from women across the country. We are able to provide 119 new Scholar Grants this year — awarding 22% of applicants. While we are thrilled to award new and continuing Scholar Grants to 260 women, our goal is to provide the grant to all who qualified.


Across the country, there are over 1 million potential candidates for a Rankin Scholar Grant. We know first-hand there's a need as the only national program offering unrestricted grants to women 35 and older (25+ in Georgia and Montana) who on limited means are working toward their first associate or bachelor's degree.
